FIRE:

Chief presented on invoice for \$ 27.99 which was approved by the Commissioners.
Chief turned in \$20 from a firefighter for Class reimbursement.
Chief is applying for a grant to install an exhaust fume removal unit in the fire bays. The amount he is applying for is \$ 47,650 of which the Village would be liable for 5% or \$2,382 which would come from the General Building Account.

On Saturday, October 27, North Walpole will join several other departments in honoring a young boy with terminal cancer by visiting the boy's home.

Again this year on Halloween, October 31st, the North Walpole Fire Department will be set up at the North Walpole School to hand out treats and hot cocoa.

WATER:

Noted that the fuse for the booster pump on the hill needs replacing. Power Company needs to be contacted. Booster pump is between Taylor and Mountain View.
Updated Lead & Copper test sources has been faxed to Concord.
Com O'Brien is processing the annual Chemical Monitoring Waiver report.
Noted that Bob and Members of GSRW checks on the leak at the RR Tunnel at end of Center Street and could find no pipe leak as the source. It is believed to be coming from ground water runoff.
